Native American Music Returns to Fields by the Ontalaunee *(better known today as the Maiden Creek)*

You probably know that the Dreibelbis Historic Farm was the site of one of the largest Native American villages in eastern Pennsylvania. Up until the middle of the 1700s, the Saucunk band of the Lenape Tribe inhabited the banks of the creeks that join in Virginville. With the help of the Hawk Mountain Chapter of the Society for Pennsylvania Archaeology, we will again hold a Celebration of the Spring Equinox at our historic farm. The outdoor event will include History and Storytelling, Native American Flute music, crafts, education, and demonstration activities along with displays of ancient Indian artifacts. Admission is Free and open to the public (Donations welcomed). Parking is on-site at the Virginville farm—GPS address, 356 Hard Hill Road, Hamburg. **The Date & Time is Sunday, March 19th, 2pm till sunset.** Bring a chair and join in this uplifting, historical experience. **Come, soak in the haunting tones of the flute, join in the circle around the equinox fire!**
